

LPC/COVENANT PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE

I wish I had better news for you on this subject, but we are no further along than before, as for finding a fulltime pastor. It appears that every time we increase our offering, so does everyone else, and the net result is, no new applicants.

I would share one thing with you about the changes to the Presbytery's website, CLC2. The technicians who control the design of the sight have added a "sliding bar" with regards to our salary offering. At the current time both the Covenant and Longwood sessions have approved a salary cap of \$60,000. While that doesn't seem like a lot for a college grad (plus seminary), the total package for the candidate is more like \$95,000 by the time you add in insurance, retirement, and other required extras.

So, we are patiently (?) waiting for God's answer to our needs. In the meantime, continue to pray for our churches, and if you have room, for our PNC, also.
